DMBOK[®] 3.0 Governance & Operational Structure: **TRIPLE HELIX**

The Triple Helix approach integrates three core groups to drive content development:

- Editorial Board: The primary development team, led by a dedicated Lead Editor, who holds final authority over all content decisions.
- CDMP® Masters Editorial Review Panel: A formal ad hoc review committee that advices on content submissions, and offering input on the editorial strategy, themes, and topics.
- Global Data Community: An informal global network that provides iterative, real-world feedback through engagement activities and during scheduled public exposure periods.

All are guided by overarching guidance and support from the **Project Manager** and aligned with standards set by the Certification Council.

The **DAMA-I Board of Directors** maintains final authority over major milestones, ensuring the project remains strategically aligned with DAMA International's mission.
